Hi Everyone,

Greetings from a sweltering Cambodia. In the third week of April, Cambodia recorded its hottest day on record. It is horrible here, hot, hot, hot, dry, dry, dry, dusty, dusty, dusty. Bring on the rainy season. The dam has been empty for months, the local water collection areas are dry, the cows are starving as there is nothing for them to eat. The whole country is in drought. No electricity so no fans, all in all pretty tiring.

News Break: Had huge storm on Saturday evening and rain since so it looks like the drought has broken in Kep Province. The dam is overflowing and everything is clean and green again.

Heartwarming Story

As a consequence of taking students to get glasses, we became aware of free glaucoma and cataract operations during the week beginning 16th May. We sent a letter out to all students (one of whom is a monk at the local Phnom Prous pagoda) to let their grandmothers and grandfathers know. We took 10 people for eye testing to the Kampot Clinic on the 16th, 3 of whom needed operations. One declined as she was frightened. The other two accepted.

One of these was a 79 year old lady who lost all her family during the Pol Pot Regime; parents, husband, children and grandchildren. Having no family she has since lived at the local pagoda as a nun, looking after the monks. She needed an operation on both eyes so was in the hospital for a couple of days. After having lost everything meaningful in her life she has been virtually blind in recent years. Now she can see again. The world has opened up for her. She can go for walks, see the people she is speaking to. The smile on her face is a delight to see. Never have the camera when I want it!!

This is the sort of thing that happens at Kep Gardens on a regular basis. When we see a need or hear of small, inexpensive ways we can help the community we act on it. These

opportunities may be small for us but life changing for the person involved.
