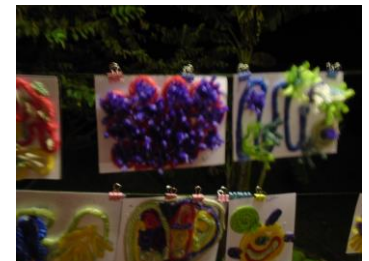
Parent Workshops

Marine Conservation

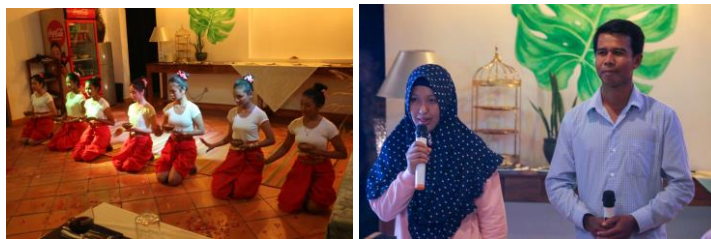
