Much happiness to hear the sound of children again, albeit only half the school in week 1 and the other half week 2.

Some sad news for students past and present; past volunteers; and the local Kampong Tralach Kep Gardens. community close to On Wednesday Fido died. He lived in various houses in the village during his time looking after his various families and puppies; attended many and ceremonies village weddings taking advantage of the scraps of food under the tables; and took part in many of the classes in the evening sitting on the back desk keeping watch on the driveway and gate. Not a good student though as he slept through most of the classes!! The last year or so he sat in Andrew's office under the fan all day. Fido lived a long life for a Khmer dog. He was 12 years old and we still see many of his offspring today. He will be sadly missed by the whole Kep Gardens community.
