Hi Everyone,

Let's hope that things are as back to normal as is possible. Cambodia has been opened up since January. Most of the population have been vaccinated twice plus have had a booster and although Omicron is raging through the country there have been very few deaths and symptoms have been relatively mild. We still have to follow strict guidelines at Kep Gardens: temperatures, masks, social distancing but we don't have to halve the classes anymore which is good.

We started the new year opening up the Kindergarten class and the Playgroup, both of which had been closed for 2 years. We have grown to 13 English classes, 1 Kindergarten, 1 Playgroup, 1 Khmer class and 128 on our waiting list. Extra staff have been employed, staff training is a priority and the beauty of it is, except for one new staff member, all are past students so we have known each other for a long time and all understand the principles of Kep Gardens and work to uphold these principles with the old and new students attending our classes.

How I love to hear the sound once again of children playing and laughing in the playground and singing in class. We're back!!








### Library
